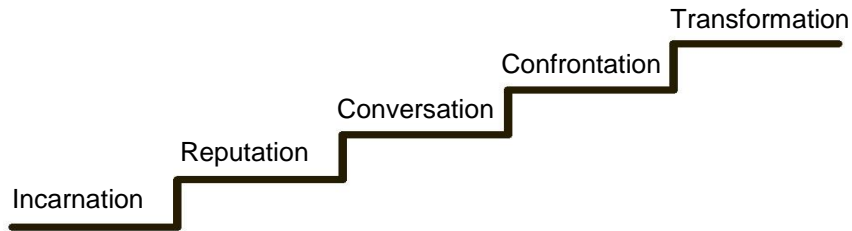

**How do I talk about Jesus with people in my circles?**

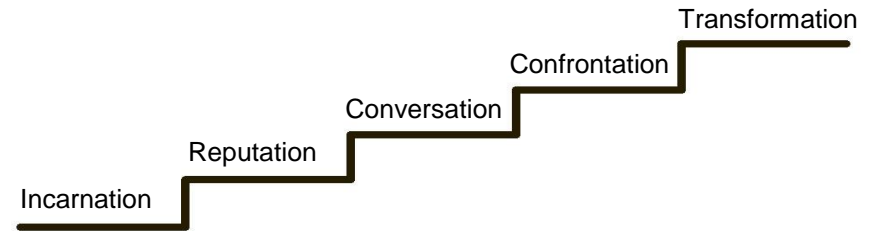

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## Beyond Reputation to Conversation

Take some time this week to think about the following questions:

1. Read 1 Peter 3:15 on the front of the notes. Take 10 minutes to think about what “revering Christ as Lord” means? What are some areas in my life where Jesus is not yet Lord? Is there a sin to confess, an error to correct, or a new direction to go? Take time to pray about those things.
2. Read John 4:4-30. What do I learn by observing Jesus’ interaction with the woman at the well? What can I learn by how the conversation went? What can I apply to possible conversations I will have with someone in one of my circles?
3. Read through one of the four gospels this week. Pay special attention to the conversations Jesus had with people he met.
4. Rehearse my story (write it out if time). What are key times when Jesus made big difference in my life? What parts of my story might someone in my circles relate to?
5. Pray for people in my circles by name. Pray for:
  - Wisdom (when to speak and when not to speak)
  - Patience (allowing the relationship/trust to grow)
  - Open doors for conversations to happen

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
